EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR GIRLS IN SIMBABWE

All fundraising projects set up by Plan International Deutschland e.V. include a number of different elements and components. To give you a better overview on how a project is set up, Plan International Deutschland e.V. lists costs for several project elements and activities. It is important to know that all elements and activities are part of a complex all-inclusive project. You can donate for the project in total, but not for single activities or assets.

Through this project, Plan International in collaboration with the Toni Garrn Foundation aims to improve the access to education for girls and to provide them with a safe and appropriate learning environment so that more girls have the chance to successfully graduate from school.

Setting up a boarding facility for girls:

To improve the access to education, Plan is building three boarding facilities for girls, one at Rimbi secondary school, one at Mutandahwe secondary school and one at Beacon Hill secondary school. All dormitories are equipped with beds, linen, tables and chairs. They have some corners for reading and studying, cooking and washing facilities. A new solar panel will provide electricity for the building. The boarding facilities are built for housing the most marginalized girls and to improve their safe access to school and education. They are selected collectively by the school and community committee.

The costs for one bed including one set of linen are about 145 Euros, one Desk with a chair is about 50 Euros. Setting up and installing the solar panel costs about 3,900 Euros.

Setting up two classrooms at Chisuma secondary school: 3.700 EUR

By building and equipping two additional classrooms at Chisuma secondary school, the learning environment for all pupils (girls and boys) will be improved. This also provides space for other children from the community who currently go to schools that are far away.

The new built classrooms include 70 seat benches and tables in total, and one new teacher's desk for each class room. One bench is about 50 Euros. In total, equipping the two classrooms is about 3,700 Euros.



Training a girl at a Mentorship-Camp: 240 EUR

This project aims to improve the educational opportunities for girls. Therefore, we do not only set up boarding facilities, classrooms and toilets for girls, it is important to empower the girls themselves. To empower the girls, a special mentorship camp is set up for 30 girls, which is about 244 Euros for each girl. During the camp, the girls are more aware about their rights and gain more self-confidence. They have trainings and sessions about their rights and train their abilities to communicate. Doing so, they learn how to claim their rights. It was Toni Garrn's visit to Zimbabwe in 2015 that created the idea to this activity. A similar mentorship camp will be held also for 30 boys.



Training a mentor for a girls' club: 200 EUR

Plan International supports Girls' clubs at all project schools in order to support the girls learning about their rights and enable them to claim their rights at the school management and at local authorities. Diese Clubs werden von Mentorinnen geschult und begleitet. All girls' clubs are lead and accompanied by a female mentor. Six women undergo a training to be prepared and equipped for this mentorship function. They learn how to support the girls to gain more self-confidence and how to train the girls in building their skills in an age appropriate way, e.g. in communication abilities. The mentorship training in total costs about 1,200 Euros. Training one woman to become a girls' club mentor is about 200 Euros.
